

Captain Christopher Wells was born in Bournemouth and grew up in Poole, where his association with the sea was developed, sailing and fishing in Poole Harbour. He was educated at Poole Grammar School, completing A Levels before starting his sea-going career. In 1974 he began a four year cadetship with Shell Tankers, attending the Warsash School of Navigation at the University of Southampton. His early days at sea were mostly spent in the Far East, trading out of Singapore on a variety of tankers.

He continued his career with Shell, gaining his Master's Certificate in 1985 and progressing to Chief Officer, serving on a variety of ship types, including VLCCs (very large crude carriers), bulk carriers and gas carriers. He combined this with a commission in the Royal Naval Reserve, serving two weeks annually for 25 years with Maritime Forces in the Amphibious Warfare specialisation. On reaching mandatory retirement age from the RNR in 2011, Captain Wells was very pleased to be appointed Honorary Commander RNR by Her Majesty the Queen. In 1992 Captain Wells joined Cunard Line when a vacancy became available for a Second Officer on board Queen Elizabeth 2. He was promoted through the ranks, serving as Chief Officer on QE2, as well as Cunard Countess and Royal Viking Sun, before being promoted to Staff Captain on board QE2 in 1999. Captain Wells met his wife Hedda on board QE2. They were married in 1997 in her hometown of Husum in the North of Germany and now live in Barnham, near Chichester, in West Sussex. They have three children; Henry, Emily and William. In April 2002 Captain Wells was appointed to the site team at the shipyard of Chantiers de l' Atlantique at Saint Nazaire, France to represent Cunard Line during the construction of Queen Mary 2. He was the first Staff Captain of the new ship when she was handed over to Cunard on 22 December 2003, remaining with her until May 2005. Following the merger of P&O Princess with Cunard's parent company Carnival, Captain Wells was then appointed to Caribbean Princess as Staff Captain. In April 2006 Captain Wells was promoted to command P&O's Oriana and he has subsequently also commanded Oceana and P&O Australia's Pacific Dawn. He was then honoured and delighted to return to Cunard Line to command Queen Victoria, Queen Elizabeth and now Queen Mary 2.

Ship's security notice.

In order to prevent unauthorised persons boarding the ship, you are required to carry your guest identification card with you when going ashore. You will be asked to produce this at the gangway when you leave and return to the ship. It may be prudent that you also have a Government issued picture ID with you before leaving the ship, as you may be required to show this at security checkpoints upon your return. Be aware that we have established a secure area around the vessel and our security procedures require that you must be prepared to show your guest identification card when entering this area, in addition to showing it to the security staff at the gangway when leaving or boarding the ship. We kindly ask you not to accept and bring on board any parcels or packages from strangers. Before boarding the ship, you may also be asked by our Security Staff to open parcels or handbags which you are carrying. We are sure that you will appreciate that this security is in the best interest of all concerned.

Environmental notice.

UK VAT

Due to European VAT Regulations, UKVAT is payable during Southampton - Hamburg voyages where the ship does not call at a port outside of the EU. This VAT will be payable on the following on board items goods purchased in the on board shops, Photo Gallery and products purchased in the Spa. It does not apply, however, to treatments and services in the Spa. During the period where VAT will be charged you will be unable to purchase liquor and tobacco products for taking home. Prices displayed on board are exclusive of VAT and therefore the VAT element will be added to the advertised price, where applicable, upon purchase. The VAT element will be itemised separately on your receipt. Please note the charging of VAT is applicable to all guests.

Shuttle service.

A shuttle service will be in operation from arrival to Place Perret in Le Havre centre. The fare is \$6.00 per person for adults and \$3.00 for children (under 12). Transfer time is approximately 15 to 20 minutes each way. The first bus will be available at 8.00am. The last departure from the city back to the ship will be at 6.00pm. There will be wheelchair accessible buses in the rotation. Please prepare your guest identification card ready for scanning before boarding the bus. Please take into consideration that queues are expected at peak hours. As an alternative, taxis will be available.



Le Havre is the largest city in the Normandy region, with 193,000 inhabitants. Le Havre de Grâce was established in 1517 by King Francis I of France (at the time it was named Franciscopolis after the king). In 1820 and 1852 the city was enlarged - firstly by pushing back the original ramparts and finally by demolishing them. The port initially grew with increasing trade during the 18th century and eventually emigration to America in the 19th century, quickly becoming Normandy's biggest population centre. In September 1944, during the Battle of Normandy, 80% of the city was destroyed and the port was completely devastated. Le Havre was given the Legion of Honour Award on 18 July 1949 and was designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 2005. The re-emergence of the city over the past twenty years has been led by large scale redevelopment of the lower town area in the Modernist style.
